

Authentic, community-based learning strategies

- Work-based learning tied to integrated academic and career technical courses
- Place-based learning
- Service learning

Integrated care, supports, and services

- Comprehensive, wraparound services
- Relational environment
- Expanded learning time that deepens relationships, experiences

Broad base of engaged and agentive stakeholders

- Distributed, collaborative leadership
- Inclusive decision-making structures
- Locally-designed curriculum, instructional strategies, assessments, and interventions

California's Investment in Community Schools 2021-2022

- \$45M in 2020 Budget Act to support existing community school programs
- \$264.9M in 2021-22 Proposed Budget for new and existing community schools
- Governor's May budget revision will likely target student wellness, mental health, community schools
