

Real Connections for Real Life



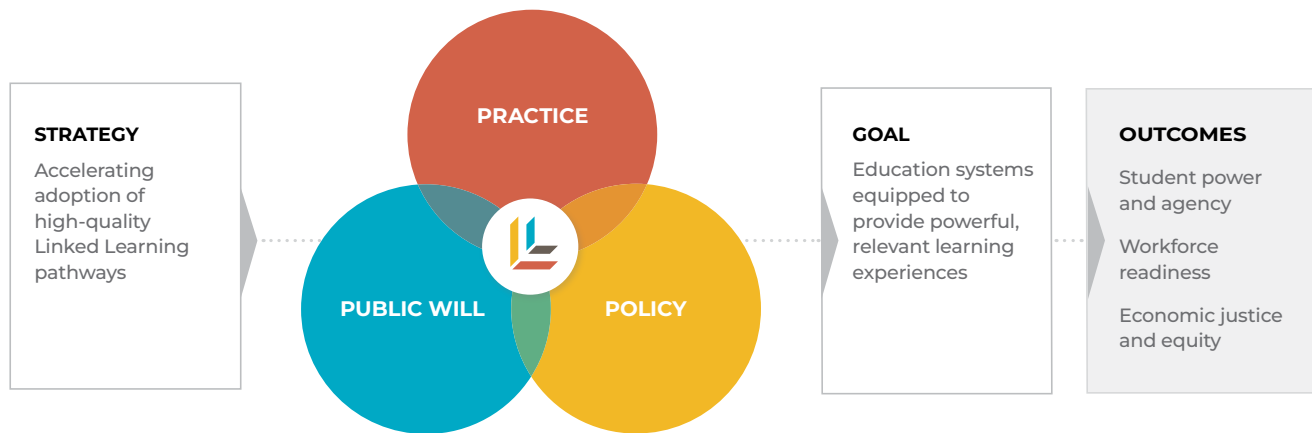
