



# OUSD High School Network: Indicators of Success

## The four-year cohort graduation rate improved overall.




## The four-year cohort graduation rate improved for some LCAP focal groups.



## The dropout rate reduced.




## The dropout rate reduced for most LCAP focal groups.




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
## A-G completion rate improved overall.

Oakland’s graduation rate shows substantial growth over the period, improving from 60.5% in 2013–14 to 79.5% in 2023–24. OUSD’s +19 percentage-point growth is the largest improvement among comparable districts, starting from the lowest baseline (60.5%) in 2013–14 and catching up to other higher-performing districts.
